POPE FRANCIS' MESSAGE FOR 4TH WORLD DAY FOR GRANDPARENTS & THE ELDERLY Theme "Do not cast me off in my old age" (cf. Ps 71:9)

Pope Francis established a World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly which took place for the first time on Sunday 25 July 2021. It is celebrated on the Sunday closest to the Feast of Saints Joachim and Anne, Grandparents of Jesus. The closest Sunday is 28 July - next weekend, but as the Feast Day occurs during the coming week, on Friday 26 July, it is timely to take a look at the Pope's Message on grandparents, who hold a special role in passing on their faith to the next generation. In his Message, the Pope reassures us that "God never abandons His children, never." He referred to the elderly as 'the firm foundation' on which 'new' stones can rest, in order to join in erecting a spiritual edifice (cf. 1 Peter 2:5). Here is a summary of the main points. Fear of loneliness: Both the "certainty of God's closeness at every stage of life and the fear of abandonment, particularly in old age and in times of pain," can be found in the Bible, Pope Francis writes. And these words "reflect an utterly evident reality." "All too often, loneliness is the bleak companion of our lives as elderly persons and grandparents." Pope Francis acknowledges. "There are many reasons for this loneliness," he continues, "in many places, above all in the poorer countries, the elderly find themselves alone because their children are forced to emigrate." He describes the situation of the elderly left in their war-torn countries as "the only signs of life in areas where abandonment and death seem to reign supreme."

The Pope decries the beliefs of some cultures where the elderly "are suspected of using witchcraft to sap the vital energies of the young" and thus are blamed for blows of fate affecting the young. "This accusation that the elderly 'rob the young of their future' is nowadays present everywhere. It appears under other guises even in the most advanced and modern societies.'

A conspiracy surrounding the life of the elderly: "The Psalm cited above, speaks to a conspiracy surrounding the life of the elderly." the Pope writes. "Abandonment of the elderly is not by chance or inevitable, but the fruit of decisions – political, economic, social and personal decisions - that fail to acknowledge the infinite dignity of each person, 'beyond every circumstance, state or situation the person may ever encounter'." The Holy Father laments that "nowadays many women and men seek personal fulfilment in a life as independent as possible and detached from other people." "The passage from 'us' to 'me' is one of the most evident signs of our times," he writes. "Solitude and abandonment have become recurrent elements in today's social landscape,".

Following in Ruth's footsteps: The Holy Father cites the story of Naomi from the Book of Ruth. Naomi, who had grown old, urged her two daughters to leave her and return to their native towns and their homes. Naomi sees herself as a burden and considers it better to step aside. One of her daughters does as the mother suggests. The other, Ruth, "does not leave Naomi's side and, to her surprise, tells her: 'Do not press me to leave you' (Ruth 1:16)," the Holy Father writes. "Ruth is not afraid to challenge customs and inbred patterns of thought."

The Holy Father's Message concludes with an appeal: "In place of the self-centred attitude that leads to loneliness and abandonment, let us instead show the open heart and the joyful face of men and women who have the courage to say 'I will not abandon you', and to set out on a different path." He ends his Message by conveying his blessing and prayers, "to all of you, dear grandparents and elderly persons, and to all those who are close to you."

Catholic Grandparents Association (CGA): This is an excellent resource for the World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly. The main mission of the CGA is "To help Grandparents pass on the faith and keep prayer in the heart of family life". They do this by providing advice and information to help Grandparents pass on the faith, organising pilgrimages for grandparents, events, prayer appeals, adopt-a-prayer-child, and.... to establish a World Grandparents Day! The CGA was founded by 74vear-old grandmother of ten, Catherine Wiley, and she was instrumental in bringing this last mission to fruition. Through the CGA she first proposed that the Church institute a day for grandparents in 2012 in her address at the 50th International Eucharistic Congress in Dublin. Then in 2017, the CGA formally asked Pope Francis to set aside a day in the Church's calendar that would recognise the contribution grandparents make to families, society and the faith. The request was made at the annual National Grandparents' Pilgrimage to Knock Shrine, attended by over 5,000 grandparents, and had the blessing of the CGA's patron, Archbishop Michael Neary of Tuam. The first a World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly established Pope Francis took place on Sunday 25 July 2021. Take a look at their website at: www.catholicgrandparentsassociation.org

Suggested activities: How can we mark this World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly in our parish and homes? Here are a few ideas: Light a candle at church or home for grandparents; send a spiritual bouquet to a grandparent or elderly person, letting them know they are prayed for; say a Novena or the Rosary for their intentions; start a prayer chain to pray regularly for their intentions; post a prayer on St Peter's School prayer intention wall (see link overleaf); call on an elderly relative or neighbour for a friendly chat or to help with shopping.


