### **58TH WORLD DAY OF PEACE**

World Day of Peace was first instituted in 1967 by Pope St Paul VI. This day is especially pertinent in these times of escalation of war, conflict and increased fear around the world. In England and Wales, the Bishops have designated the **Second Sunday in** Ordinary Time as *Peace Sunday*, a day when parishes are encouraged to reflect on the Pope's message for the year. Each year, the Holy Father addresses a Message of good wishes and hope to Heads of State and Government, Heads of International Organisations, Leaders of different religions and every person of good will. Pope Francis' theme for his message this year is Forgive us our trespasses: Grant us your peace.

In his message, Pope Francis reflects on the hope and justice at the heart of the Jubilee Year. Hope is the preponderant theme of this 58th Message. Pope Francis invites us to look at the many challenges that severely endanger the survival of humanity and Creation with a heart full of hope. To do this, it is necessary to rely on God's mercy. By His forgiving our debts, we will rediscover ourselves all children of the Father, and therefore all brothers and sisters, united on the path of peace. More concretely, then, Pope Francis recommends three actions that can truly mark a path of peace: the forgiveness of the international debt; the abolition of the death penalty; the establishment of a World Fund that will definitively eliminate hunger.

The Holy Father begins by recalling that, in the Jewish tradition, the Jubilee was a special year in which God's justice was restored in every aspect of life. He writes: "In our day too, the Jubilee is an event that inspires us to seek to establish the liberating justice of God in our world." (#3).

### **Systemic interconnected challenges**

In considering the challenges we face, the Pope highlights the inhuman treatment of migrants, environmental decay, the confusion created by disinformation, the refusal to dialogue, and the immense resources spent on war.

These challenges require not "sporadic acts of philanthropy" but change on a personal, cultural, and structural level "in order to confront the present state of injustice and inequality."

#### All of us are debtors

The message reminds us that we are all debtors to God. Drawing on the words of **St Basil of Caesarea**, the Holy Father stresses that everything we claim as our own is, in fact, a gift from God. The earth's resources belong to all humanity, "not just a privileged few", the Pope says. "Once we lose sight of our relationship to the Father, we begin to cherish the illusion that our relationships with others can be governed by a logic of exploitation and oppression, where might makes right.'

To set us on a renewed journey of hope during the Jubilee Year, Pope Francis offers three concrete proposals.

#### 1. Debt cancellation

Pope Francis renews the appeal launched by Pope Saint John Paul II on the occasion during the Jubilee Year 2000 to consider "reducing substantially, if not cancelling outright, the international debt which seriously threatens the future of many nations" (#11). "Foreign debt has become a means of control whereby certain governments and private financial institutions of the richer countries unscrupulously and indiscriminately exploit the human and natural resources of poorer countries, simply to satisfy the demands of their own markets", he says. He also highlights the "ecological debt" owed by richer countries, but which burdens other peoples of less developed parts of the world. The Pope argues that the call for debt cancellation is "an appeal for solidarity, but above all for justice" (#8).

#### 2. Commitment to respect the dignity of human life

Without hope for the future, it becomes hard for the young to look forward to bringing new lives into the world. The Pope calls for a commitment to the dignity of human life at all stages, and advocates for the abolition of the death penalty and the promotion of a culture of life that values each person. The penalty, the Pope says, "not only compromises the inviolability of life but eliminates every human hope of forgiveness and rehabilitation".

## 3. A new global fund

Pope Francis urges diverting funds from armaments to a global fund which could end hunger, foster sustainable development and combat climate change.

"Peace, does not only come with the end of wars" the Holy Father tells us, "but with the dawn of a new world, a world in which we realise that we are different, closer and more fraternal than we ever thought possible".

**Prayer:** The Pope's message finishes with this prayer:

Forgive us our trespasses, Lord, as we forgive those who trespass against us. In this cycle of forgiveness, grant us your peace, the peace that you alone can give to those who let themselves be disarmed in heart,

to those who choose in hope to forgive the debts of their brothers and sisters, to those who are unafraid to confess their debt to you,

and to those who do not close their ears to the cry of the poor. Amen
